

Designated Family Member or Support Person Pre-Screening Questionnaire: LTC

Each resident is able to designate two family members/support people to come into the home (1 at a time), which are to be documented by the care team. When arriving at a home, the first 3 questions are asked daily as part of entryway screening. An answer of YES to any, will result in you not being allowed to enter that day.

The 4th question is for times where you are pre-planning a visit – if you answer YES to any of question 4, you would still be allowed to enter but present a higher than normal risk and, as such, will need to mask even for outdoor visits.

We'd ask you to consider alternate ways of supporting the resident, either through rescheduling or asking for the other designated family member/support person to take your place.

We are not screening for seasonal or environmental allergies; the following questions are meant to capture new symptoms, or a worsening of long-standing symptoms. **Thank you for helping us keep everyone safe!**
