The SK SMART Pump Program is in the process of updating the provincial Parenteral Manual. This manual provides practitioners guidance on safe administration of medications. With the implementation of the Medfusion 4000 for pediatric patients, the monographs have been updated to reflect pediatric and neonatal information.

Once the entire province has rolled the new Medfusion 4000 pumps out, the Sask Kids Pediatric Parenteral Drug Manual will be removed from service and there will no longer be separate Adult and Pediatric drug monographs.
