David Wickes, DC, MA is the President of the Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College in Toronto, Ontario.

Dr. David Wickes received his DC degree in 1977 from the National College of Chiropractic, completed a residency and specialized in the diagnosis and management of chronic disorders. He has a master's degree in education and human development from George Washington University. Prior to his move to Toronto, he had served as the Dean of the University of Bridgeport College of Chiropractic, the first university-based chiropractic program in the United States, and as an executive administrator at the University of Western States and the National University of Health Sciences. He has been the President of the Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College (CMCC) in Toronto, Canada since 2014. He is known for his work in simulation-based training and assessment, accreditation, curriculum design, and educational technology.

During this presentation, Dr. Wickes will review the current status of spinal manipulation, including recent research on outcomes, indications and contraindications, and modern instructional methods for the development of competencies in manipulation. Included will be an overview of Force Sensing Table Technology® developed at CMCC and now used in more than 40% of chiropractic programs around the world.
