Registered Nurses (RN) and Registered Psychiatric Nurse (RPN) are in high demand in Saskatchewan. Full-time, Part-time and casual opportunities are available in rural and urban communities across Saskatchewan. The highest demand is currently in log term care, regional hospitals, home care and rural health centers. The Saskatchewan Health Authority offers some of the highest wages and premiums in Canada and are currently offering a hiring incentive of up to \$7,500 for specified locations in Saskatchewan.

Registered Nurse (RN)

In order to practice as a Registered Nurse in Saskatchewan, individuals must;

- · Obtain a Bachelor Degree/ Diploma in Nursing
- · Registered or eligible for registration with the College of registered Nurses of Saskatchewan (CRNS)
- Basic Life Support (BLS)

Registered Psychiatric Nurse (RPN)

In order to practice as a Registered Psychiatric Nurse in Saskatchewan, individuals must:

- · Obtain a Bachelor Degree/ Diploma in Nursing
- Register or be eligible for registration with the College of registered Nurses of Saskatchewan (CRNS)
- Register or be eligible for registration with the Registered Psychiatrics Nurses Association of Saskatchewan (RPNAS)
- Obtain Basic Life Support (BLS)

Hourly Wage

Below is the April 1, 2023 salary scale for RNs and RPNs working in a provincial health region as a member of the Saskatchewan Union of Nurses (SUN).

Job Title Hourly Wage April 1, 2023

Grad Nurse \$33.30 Nurse A \$38.58 - \$50.07 \$42.04 - \$52.44 Nurse B \$45.85 - \$56.14 Nurse C

A Grad Nurse is a nurse who has not yet passed the NCLEX or RPNCE

Nurse A is a general duty nurse, psychiatric nurse, ER or OR nurse

Nurse B includes senior positions, such as Clinical Nurse Educator or Public Health Nurse

Nurse C positions generally involve supervision, for example, a Lead Clinical Nurse Educator or Public Health Nurse Supervisor

This is a great way to gain confidence and experience communities and facilities you may not otherwise get exposure to. This may also help you decide where you want to work when you complete your nursing program.
