Dr. Michelle Shaw, PhD, is a Registered Doctoral Psychologist in Saskatchewan who has practiced in the field of neuropsychology for the past 23 years, assessing individuals with mild, moderate, and severe ABIs. She is a graduate of the Universities of Regina and Saskatchewan and completed her predoctoral internship in Edmonton where her training primarily focused on clinical neuropsychology. Additionally, she has served three terms as Member at Large on Council for the Saskatchewan College of Psychologists and served two terms as board member on the Provincial Advisory Board for the ABI Partnership Project.

Concussion has evolved as an area of research and clinical practice fraught with controversies and conflicting information. Current best practice for concussion diagnosis will be reviewed. Outcomes will be examined within the context of findings from studies employing the most robust research methodologies. Stemming from these findings, current guidelines for concussion management will be reviewed. By employing an evidence-based, best practice approach to concussion, unnecessary disability can be minimized and optimal functioning for clients can be achieved in a timely manner.
