### The Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) Wants YOU!



Emergency Medical Responders play a vital role in our communities by providing emergency medical care for patients including assessing, patient care, transferring and transporting.

#### The SHA is offering a Hybrid EMR Certificate Program:

- **Dates:** February 13, March 13- 15, March 27 - 29, April 10 - 12, April 24-26
- **Program type:** Hybrid Delivery — Online (Friday evenings) and In-Person (Saturday - Sunday in Melfort)
- **Seats available:** 12
- **Course Cost:** Bursary-Funded (all program costs covered), requiring a one-year Return for Service Agreement if employed by the Saskatchewan Health Authority or Saskatchewan Ambulance Service
- **Qualifications:**
  - Applicants must be 18 years of age or older
  - Grade 10
  - A valid Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Search (dated within the last 6 months)
  - Standard First Aid certificate with CPR Level C certificate

**Note:** Participants are responsible for any and all exam & licensing fees

By completing this certificate you will be eligible to work as an Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) with the Saskatchewan Health Authority.
